



Pupil Development Grant Plan 2019-20

To reduce attainment gaps of vulnerable pupils and improve outcomes for all pupils in personal, social and well-being.

Success Criteria:

- All children, including vulnerable groups make realistic and sustained progress across the school
- Staff have the same expectations for every child to make good or better progress in their learning, to achieve well and to have the best opportunities
- Effective use of resources to improve outcomes

Activities

Robust identification of need to disadvantaged pupils, their circumstances, current achievement and progress, together with clear procedures for tracking individual progress

Priority 1

All staff to identify and evidence progress by Vulnerable Pupils

Priority 2

A systematic approach to intervention, support and providing feedback to individual learners, including those at risk of disengaging

To implement new and effective ways of teaching and learning to impact on progress of vulnerable learners

Priority 3

Access to enrichment activities, the removal of any financial barriers to participation of curricular activities and opportunities through out-of-school-hours provision

To promote greater involvement of vulnerable learners in enrichment activities to develop confidence and resilience

Priority 4

Making provision of high quality for learners experiencing disadvantage who have additional learning needs

To have secure assessment procedures in place for all EAL pupils, including new arrivals



Priority 5

Making provision of high quality for learners who have additional learning needs, social emotional and behavioural needs

To engage in preparation for the ALN Act

Priority 6

A systematic approach to interventions, support, including those whose attendance is a cause for concern

To increase attendance and reduce late-coming
